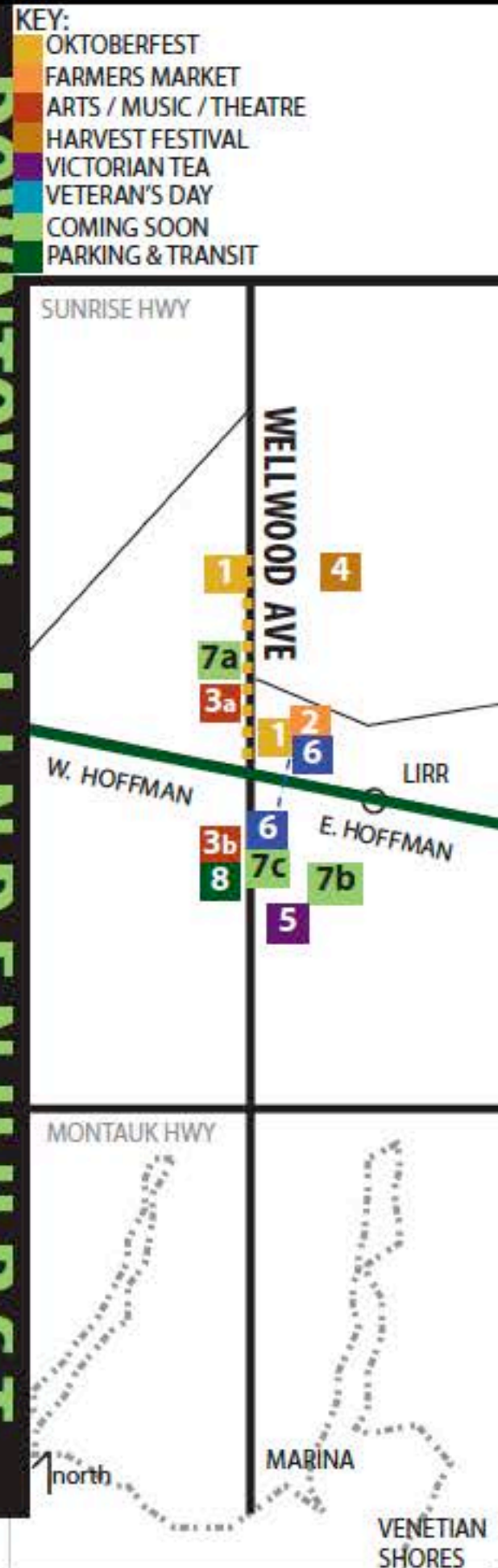

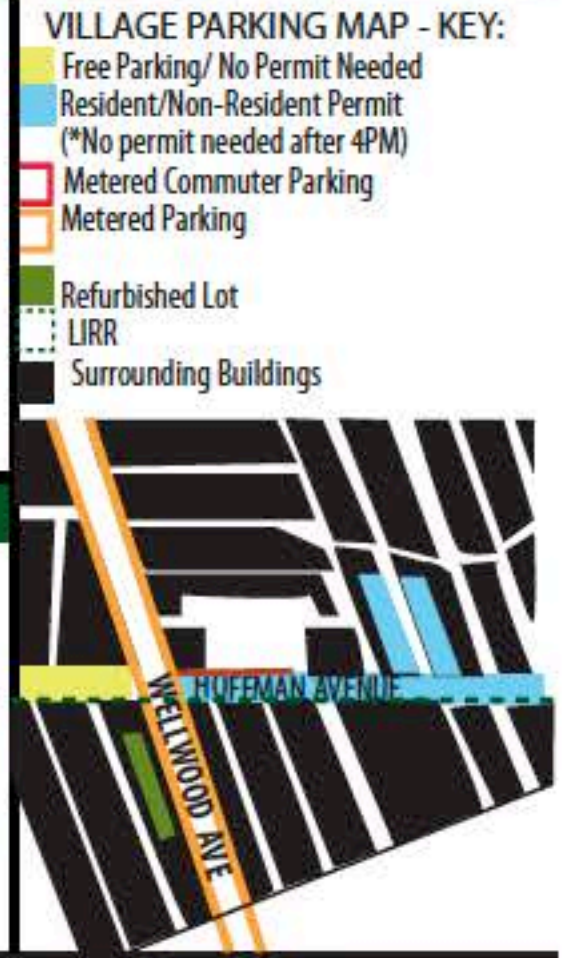
6 VETERANS' DAY
 SAT. NOV. 11
 The Village of Lindenhurst and the United Veterans Council of Lindenhurst honor and thank all military personnel who served the U. S. Armed Forces. A march from the Village Square on the N.E. corner of Wellwood and Hoffman Avenues proceeds to the WW I Monument Plaza on S. Wellwood Avenue. Participants in the march include members of the American Legion Post 1120, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Wade Burns Post 7279, Scout Troops, and local dignitaries, clergy, and elected officials. A ceremony takes place at 11:11 am signifying the moment an armistice between Germany and Allied Nations came into effect. All residents are urged to attend this important event.

 The Business Improvement District (BID) has replaced the village clock, to be unveiled during 2017.



8 PARKING / TRANSIT
REFURBISHED SOUTH 1ST ST. PARKING LOT
 The parking lot between S. 1st St. and S. 2nd St. is being given a face-lift with funds provided by a NYS Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$50,000.00. Improvements include new asphalt with striping, a new wooden guard rail to protect neighboring residences, new curbing, sidewalks and low maintenance grass plantings. Both entrances to this area will be adorned with a solar-powered street light and decorative signage. The Village Department of Public Works is making every effort to keep costs low and utilize the funding to the maximum capacity. Stated completion is Fall 2017. Residents are urged to take advantage of this newly refurbished lot. A walkway exists between the new Fire Department Mainhouse and Linden Flower Shop for easy access to shopping in the downtown business district.
